This Halloween - Keep Trick-or-Treaters Safe

On Halloween, your neighbourhood will be swarming with children, and it's your job to be sure they take their treats home safely.

- Fatal collisions between motor vehicles and young pedestrians* (under 15 years of age) happen most frequently between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. - prime trick-or-treating time.
- 84% of deaths among young pedestrians occurred at non-intersection locations* (*indicating children are most likely to dart and dash from mid-block into the street*).



Follow these driving tips for a safe Halloween:

- Reduce distractions, such as cell phones or loud music, and stay alert
- Stay well below the posted speed limit.
- Pay attention to what's happening on sidewalks and roadways. Watch for children darting across streets, especially between parked cars.
- Be extra alert when pulling in and out of driveways.
- Do not assume children can see you or are paying attention.
- Do not pass other vehicles that have stopped in the roadway. They could be dropping off children.
- If you're driving to a Halloween party, put that mask on after you park the car.
